

- * First graders will now be tested weekly on their spelling words! Please practice at home. We are reviewing simple, short vowel words first to build your child's confidence on his/her spelling tests.



Some curriculum news for the week:

Religion We will be learning more about the Bible, as we read parables and other Bible stories to learn more about our faith. We will review the Old and New Testaments. We'll also talk about how God is like a Good Shepherd and think about what that means to us.

<u>Language Arts</u> Our spelling words

this week are on, got, fox, pop, not, & hop (we are focusing on short o words). Our challenge word is Jesus! We are also learning that English words do not usually end in u, v, or i (with some exceptions, including the word "you"), every syllable in a word must contain a vowel, and the vowels a,e,o,u usually say their name at the end of an open syllable (the e in "she" make a long e sound, the o in "go" makes a long o sound, etc.). As students are writing, I will now expect them to apply these spelling rules, as well as correctly spell the words they are tested on each Friday in any writing.

Social Studies

We began our study of Thanksgiving last week and will be spending the month learning about early Thanksgiving traditions, as well as reflecting on the blessings in each of our own lives. We are also working on a secret project that will be revealed to you at our parent/teacher/student conference!
