Some curriculum highlights:

Religion

This week, we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, in which Mary is honored as she was born free of sin. We will also continue our learning of Advent as the time in which we wait for Jesus to be born! We will discuss patience, one of the 12 Fruits of the Holy Spirit (what others can see in us when we let the Holy Spirit work in our hearts), and talk about ways we can be more patient in our lives, as well as how we can patiently prepare for Christmas.

Language Arts

Our spelling words this week are <u>that</u>, <u>then</u>, <u>this</u>, <u>them</u>, <u>thick</u>, <u>tenth</u>, <u>with</u>, <u>and bath</u> (we are focusing on the two-letter phonogram "th"). Our challenge word is <u>Mary</u>! Our dictation sentence is <u>See my dog.</u>
