Some curriculum news for the week:

Language Arts

We will not have any spelling words this week, due to the short week! In class, we will continue to review words previously learned, as well as apply the rules we are learning in spelling.

We have been learning about using text evidence to answer questions or write about a topic. By looking back at a text we have read, we can find evidence to support our writing!

Science/Social Studies

We will be starting a new unit in science: teeth/dental health! We will learn about the different parts of our teeth, how to keep our teeth and gums healthy, and even about the teeth of other animals. Students will be examining their own teeth using a handheld mirror. We will also be comparing and contrasting human teeth to other animals' teeth.

We will be learning all about various symbols, people, and landmarks that symbolize the United States. We'll also be learning from one another next week about our many presidents as we participate in our Parade of Presidents.

STAR OF THE WEEK




LIESEL
