A few curriculum highlights for this week:

Religion

Our next chapter is entitled "God's Gifts for Us," in which we will appreciate that all of Creation is God's gift to his, and his Son, Jesus, is his greatest gift. We will also talk about our own gifts (given to us by God) and ways we can use our gifts in the world.

Reading

Our reading theme this week centers around school; skills include reading/writing words with short o, identifying action verbs, reviewing nouns and possessive nouns, and thinking about the sequence of events in a story. We will be reading Curious George stories, Mo Willems books, and a few Robert Munsch stories. We will be applying what we know about characters, setting, book type, etc. to these silly fiction stories!

Science

We are learning about predictions and observations this week through some fun experiments! We are learning that scientists observe with their five senses and have tools that can help them with these observations as well.

Math

We are finishing up our first chapter on addition concepts this week. We have been exploring the various ways to make sums of 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10. For example, there are many ways to make a sum of 4: 0+4, 1+3, 2+2, 3+1, and 4+0. We've been practicing our math fluency facts (and will continue to do so throughout the year). We learned and used addition vocabulary like "sum" (the answer to an addition problem), "addends" (the two parts you add together to find the sum), and "true/false."




